A. I like seeing all the students and families eating, having fun, and enjoying it.

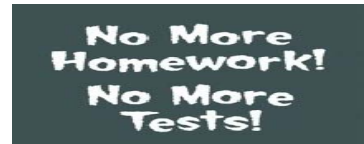
Q. How does spirit night help the school?
